Dear Chairwoman Spilka and Vice Chairman DiDomenico:

I write to you in support of **House Bill 4427, An Act reforming alimony in the Commonwealth**, which was unanimously passed to be engrossed by the House of Representatives on June 22, 2016 and now rests before the Senate Committee on Ways and Means.

This bill is a necessary overhaul of the Supreme Judicial Court's modifications to the Alimony Reform Act of 2011. In 2015, the Supreme Judicial Court ruled that only alimony payers who divorced after March 1, 2012 can receive the full benefits of alimony reform. This leaves all divorcees who cannot qualify with the obligation to pay alimony even when they are retired, regardless of income status.

It is imperative that Massachusetts sets a high standard for the rest of the country in defense of divorcees who would otherwise be burdened with unaffordable alimony payments. This bill ultimately serves as a minor technical alteration that will benefit the increasing population of divorcees in the Commonwealth.

I respectfully ask that H.4427 be reported on favorably by the Senate Committee on Ways and Means. Thank you for your time and consideration of these important matters. Please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions or concerns.
